A Message From the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery:

We have an ASL retailer story to share concerning ticket theft -- and what you can do to stop it.

Raymond Brown, manager of Flash Market #194 in Fayetteville, maintains a tracking sheet of lottery transactions. He uses cash register reports and instant ticket tracking reports to reconcile transactions occurring the previous day compared to the number of tickets remaining. One morning, the count of \$20 tickets was off. After doublechecking, he called the ASL Security Hotline to give them the missing game and pack numbers. It was discovered that some had been cashed in nearby at Country Lane Liquor (Prairie Grove) and Green Oak Center (Farmington). Steven McAlpin and Steve Sharma, respective store managers, were contacted. Thanks to the store managers, who provided security video and other evidence identifying the person cashing in the tickets, police arrested the alleged perpetrator.

Congratulations to Brown for keeping such good track of his inventory – and kudos to McAlpin and Sharma, who so readily cooperated with their fellow retailer, ASL Security and local police to quickly solve this. We think this is a textbook example of how retailers should react when faced with ticket theft.
