	store specialty:	This still-new Mapco Mart in Sherwood is a gargantuan store with many features. There's a huge coffee bar, a newsstand, 15 gas pumps, a to-go food area with salads, sandwiches and fruit, as well as grocery, convenience store and automotive items. But Ney says the best part of the store is My Deli, which offers salads, soups and sandwiches – and every-thing "handmade from scratch," he said. "Even the meatballs are hand-rolled. It's good, good food. It's the first one in Arkansas; we have a different food concept. It's something new." In rolling out the new expanded Mapco store concept in Sherwood, Ney said, "It's something big, something wide open."
